## Aid To Timbuktu: Goats and School Supplies

Frank and Fran Casa have donated \$1,000 to provide scholarships of \$20 each for elementary students in Timbuktu. That amount will be sufficient to cover their school supplies and books for a full year allowing some students to remain in school. The plan is to divide this among the 10 elementary schools making sure that there will be an equal number of boys and girls represented. In order to provide 6 scholarships to each school \$1200 is needed. The Casos hope

## ASU Program: Summer in Macedonia

The ASU Melikian Center and its Critical Languages Institute (CLI) are offering stipends of up to \$1,000 for students of intermediate Macedonian in the CLI and graduate student stipends of up to \$3,000 for any level of Macedonian.

Details are available at (<http://cli.asu.edu/>) and (<http://cli.asu.edu/macedonian>),

but in short, the program provides 2 semesters' of university instruction in 8 weeks (May 31-July 22) in a combination of intensive classes and cultural activities. Tuition for any of these classes is waived, although fees totaling about \$700 apply.

Finally, in August, ASU offers a 3-week study-tour to Ohrid (for an additional 2 credits). Participants

need not be students, although only students can be funded

through our grant programs. Applicants can apply directly through the <http://cli.asu.edu> website.
