# Tempe reading coach tells her exchange story

My name is Mira Nikolic and I am a kindergarten through third grade reading coach at Laird School in Tempe. Last summer I experienced what school was like for New Zealand teachers and students of all grade levels

When I returned I volunteered for Oktoberfest. I am now the food chair for the event. I want to participate and give back to Sister Cities because of the opportunity they gave me. I hope that in return, more teachers and students will be able to have the experience I did.

After two weeks of participating and observing in schools, we were able to take one week of traveling. I couldn't wait to go bungee jumping! I also went off-roading and had to drive with the steering wheel on the right side of the car. We also went zorbing (rolling down a hill in a huge inflatable ball), luging down a mountain and rode in a hydro-jet boat flying and spinning over the water.

The most important thing I got from this experience was a bond with two teachers that will last forever. Also, I have met people here in Tempe through the program and continue to have relationships with them to be an active member in my community.


