
Educator Exchange News

My name is Chris Crain and this summer I was given the honor of being the Tempe Sister Cities' first Educator Exchange participant to visit Cuenca, Ecuador. I learned so much about life and education in Ecuador and was able to make friendships that will last a lifetime. Being that this was also my first trip outside the borders of the United States, I expected to learn about all the differences between our lives and the lives of people living in Ecuador. But the most important thing I learned was not how much we are different, but how much we are all the same. From the teachers I spoke with, the students I encountered, the families and friends the thing I realized is that even though we may speak different languages, we all want the same things for ourselves and our students.

My first 2 weeks were spent in Cuenca and I have to thank my hosts, Richard and Gloria Boroto. They made me feel welcome and taught me so much about life in Cuenca. I had the chance to visit educational facilities from preschools to universities. I got to see both public and private schools. Another big thanks goes to Patricia and Walter Bell of the Bell Academy in Cuenca. This was a wonderful school for children that reminded me so much of the schools here in the States. The way they care for their students and high expectations they hold made me wish they had an opening that I might be able to fill at the school! Another highlight of my time in Cuenca was being given the chance to speak twice to pre-service teachers at the University of Azuay. I made a wonderful friend in Ximena Velez Calvo, one of the faculty in the Education department at the University.

Besides seeing schools in Ecuador, I also got to experience the sights and people of both Cuenca and Quito. I visited museums, marketplaces, national parks, stores, churches, the cloud forest and even an amazing birthday party in the country home of the Bells. The highlight of the sightseeing part of my trip has to be the day I spent in Mindo, a village in the cloud forest. Butterfly farms, hummingbird preserves, a chocolate factory, an orchid farm, ziplining and even a bungee jump! And of course, a trip to Ecuador would not be complete without a visit to the Equator. I learned it's true about water swirling down the drain in different directions on different sides of our planet's dividing line. What I didn't know was that water would go straight down the drain directly on the Equator.

Many thanks to the wonderful people of Ecuador and the members of Tempe Sister Cities. I can't wait to go back and see all the things I couldn't squeeze in on my first trip to this amazing country!



The first meeting of the year for Tempe Sister City Youth was held on Sunday, August 26. Twenty three of thirty two summer delegates attended. In addition to an overview of the mission, vision and operational logistics, youth were able to provide input into what kind of meetings to conduct, philanthropy projects, guest speakers, and social activities that they would like to aim for as we build the year's calendar. The calendar will continue to be drafted in the September meeting as well so that all youth (and their parents) will have an up front big picture of the time and commitments for the overall year. During this meeting, the teens also signed up for their Oktoberfest service hours and reviewed a bit about the upcoming 40th anniversary celebration. Each delegate will then sign up in September for many different areas of his/her interest in relationship to service projects, social events, recruiting members, and fundraising events. There will no longer be just four committees in the hopes that delegates can spread their talents across many of the activities of interest. Finally, the youth received an overview of the different officer positions and responsibilities. The seniors were asked to seriously inventory their time and personal goals between August and September in order to decide the role they wish, or whether to campaign for a role. The president and vice-president will attend a monthly board meeting in addition to plan, conduct and reflect upon the youth group monthly meetings. The elected secretary will not only keep our minutes but also be responsible for writing the monthly update for the TSC Monthly and Quarterly issues. The Finance officer will work with the coordinator and the TSC Finance Committee in order to be mentored as well as be part of input on financial decisions that impact the youth and their goals for the year.

I have already witnessed talent, personality and leadership abilities and am very eager to dig in with this group of teens. Together, we make a world of difference, right here in our community of Tempe.
