The Hackett House comes alive when 6th graders grace its rooms. Hackett House volunteers offer free field trips to 6th graders. While at the site, students explore a bit of Tempe history, learn the concept of the Sister City program, and take a "minitour" of all our Sister Cities.

Last year a group of dedicated volunteers took on a task to revise the curriculum presented to 6th graders. The Arizona Social Studies standards have changed since the curriculum presentations were first written. In addition, Arizona is

implementing the Common Core Standards. In order to align the talks at the Hackett House with the State Curriculum and Standards, the year was spent rewriting presentations givens to students and making an already good program even better. The last step was to put all the material created on the website http://www.hacketthouse.o ra/for-children/schooltours/- so teachers and students can access it once they return to school.

Lori McClellan (Tempe District Administrator). Amy Jones was responsible for making us "live" on our website.

#### **EDUCATOR EXCHANGE NEWS**

While visiting New Zealand was in and of itself amazing, traveling as a Tempe Sister Cities Educator Exchange delegate opened doors to opportunities unique to this experience. Staying with a New Zealand educator and her family immediately immersed me in the culture of her country, and being introduced as a Sister Cities delegate from the United States invited people to ask me about Arizona and American culture and issues. As conversations and experiences of mutual interest and sensitivity were shared, I could feel our worlds coming closer together, and it was inspiring.

The time I spent in New Zealand schools was special. My first experience continues to be one of my warmest memories. My New Zealand "sister", Kathy, is a principal at Boulcott School. On the first day of our visit, we were greeted by a student Kapa Haka (Maori performing group) with a traditional Powhiri (welcoming ceremony). The Maori are the indigenous people of New Zealand; they are Polynesian and comprise about 14 percent of the country's population. The Maori language and traditions are woven into everyday life, offering visitors a fascinating journey of cultural discovery. The Powhiri began with a Karanga (call) for us to enter the building. We were then seated at the front of the room as the student Kapa Haka sang and danced for us. It was a beautiful and moving experience that I will never forget, establishing a strong sense of connection to the culture and people of New Zealand.

As I continued to spend time with teachers and students, I was asked many questions about life in my country. While many topics were discussed, I will tell you what consistently caused the jaws to drop open of young and old alike, best expressed through the following words of a New Zealand 3rd grader when I told her American schools do not take a break for "Morning Tea"...

(Read using your best New Zealand accent and put your hands on your hips in disdain) "No morning tea in America?!? That is so sad... and just wrong."

Morning tea in New Zealand schools is national and includes a daily time period where the entire school takes a 30-minute break. Children go onto the playground and have snacks, and all staff members meet in the lounge for tea and biscuits (cookies). I experienced morning tea in a variety of schools and they were all phenomenal. It is a beautiful time of relationship building and simply taking time to breathe. What do you think... morning tea in American schools?

My New Zealand exchange experience impacted my life in so many ways, and at so many levels. New Zealand is a country of beautiful landscape, culture, and, people, none of which I will ever forget. I returned from my travels with a notebook full of insights and inspiration, and with my perspective on life and the world around me forever changed. I wish that every student and teacher could have an experience such as mine. Thank you, Sister Cities and all of my New Zealand friends, for a truly life changing experience.
