Youth Group Rallies with Kits for Kids

Our April TSC Youth Group meeting was all about philanthropy! This month we focused on the charity Project C.U.R.E. Founded in 1987 by James Jackson, Project C.U.R.E. is the largest provider of donated medical supplies and equipment to developing countries around the world. Since then, they have made an impact in over 130 countries. Their main mission is to close the overwhelming health resource gaps in developing countries by empowering



doctors and nurses and providing them with the supplies they desperately need.

While there are a multitude of ways to get involved and volunteer for this organization, the Youth Group chose to do Kits for Kids. These kits provide basic medicine cabinet supplies and personal hygiene items that are difficult to come by in less developed countries. These kits consist of items like ibuprofen, bandaids, toothbrushes, hand sanitizer, and more. Each bag ends up in a different place. Each member of the Youth Group brought different supplies to the meeting, and we all filled the bags together. This was our first time doing this type of philanthropy, and it was definitely a learning experience.

We are very grateful for the Board members who helped us complete the kits by taking some home to get the extra supplies we needed. We really appreciate your assistance in
