PURPOSE OF THE INTERNATIONAL EDUCATOR EXCHANGE

Previous participants are **NOT eligible** to apply.

The objective of this program is to provide an opportunity for Tempe educators to develop professional educational growth and understanding among the people of **Regensburg, Germany; Lower Hutt, New Zealand; Skopje, Macedonia; Trollhättan, Sweden; *Carlow, Ireland; *Cusco, Peru**, through a family living and school teaching experience. Your family needs to be supportive of your participation and time commitment to this educator exchange. Family is important; however, *this exchange must be a priority to you*. Therefore, it is essential for you to plan ahead for family commitments so you will be **available** for **ALL MANDATORY** exchange activities. (See Calendar, page 3)

This is a professional educator exchange and is **NOT** for independent travel/activities **before or after** the educator exchange. As a participant in the exchange, understand that this program does in no way include a spouse, family member(s), or friend(s) for this foreign travel. Chosen educator ambassadors will be expected to adhere to the educator exchange travel date calendar and will depart and return to the U.S. as a group since your airfare will be paid by the Tempe Sister Cities Corporation.

EDUCATOR'S TIME COMMITMENT

The actual exchange trip for the Tempe educators to Germany, New Zealand, Macedonia, Sweden, (or *Ireland or *Peru), will be 2 to 3 weeks in the summer of 2018 (June/July); however, the travel dates are still to be determined (TBD). They vary each year due to the host countries' schedules. It is **mandatory** that the educators **attend orientation meetings** before the departure date, participate in Sister Cities activities, give talks about the exchange experience after returning, and generally help plan and promote the exchange program. The selected educators must attend these get-togethers **BEFORE** leaving for Germany, New Zealand, Macedonia, Sweden (and/or *Ireland or *Peru). This needs to be a **PRIORITY!** **Failure to do so will result in altering the final group traveling on the exchange.**

EDUCATOR RESPONSIBILITY ABROAD

The Tempe educators will live in the homes of Regensburg, Lower Hutt, Skopje, Trollhättan (or *Carlow or *Cusco) educators and share with their students by teaching prepared lessons or leading class discussions. Educators are expected to be professional and to be cooperative in the family living experience. The educators will participate in **ALL** scheduled activities.

EDUCATOR RESPONSIBILITY UPON RETURN

It is expected that participants will act as gracious hosts to the Regensburg, Lower Hutt, Skopje, Trollhättan (and/or *Carlow or *Cusco) educators during their visit here. A calendar of activities/events for the visiting educators must be prepared with the help of the Country Liaison, submitted, and approved by Linda Parrish a minimum of three weeks prior to their arrival. They should promote a positive experience for the visiting educators both at school and at home. The anticipated date of the German educators' arrival for their 3-week stay will be approximately March 22/23, 2018; the date of the New Zealand educators' visits will be tentatively Dec. 26/27, 2018; the Macedonian, Swedish (or *Irish—2 weeks) in 2018 will be announced when determined by each of their countries; the *Peruvians will be February, 2018, *if they participate this year*. You may be asked to make a report of your foreign experience to the Tempe Sister Cities Governing Board and to your faculty. You are expected to plan and promote the program for the following year. It is expected that participating educators will become active members of the Tempe Sister Cities Corporation and support and participate in Sister Cities activities and organizations (i.e. Oktoberfest, Hackett House, Youth Exchanges, etc.). Without the Sister Cities organization and the City of Tempe's administrative and the schools' support, there would not be an exchange program. **Involvement is essential.**

COSTS

Air travel expenses will be paid by the Tempe Sister Cities Corporation. You will provide your own spending money. The families in Regensburg, Lower Hutt, Skopje, Trollhättan (or *Carlow or *Cusco) will provide room and board. Participants will reciprocate "in kind" when their Regensburg, Lower Hutt, Skopje, Trollhättan (or *Carlow or *Cusco) hosts become our guests here as they did for you while visiting them. Upon selection, participants are **required** to join the Tempe Sister Cities Corporation. A family membership is \$35, due upon selection. Previous participants have experienced out-of-pocket expenses as a part of the reciprocation, which vary depending on activities and group plans. APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Each applicant must

- 1) be a U.S. citizen;
- 2) be employed by an accredited school within Tempe city limits: **all schools** in TUHSD & TD3, and **only** Kyrene, Parochial, Charter, & Private schools within Tempe city limits;
- 3) have a **minimum of three years teaching experience completed** at the time of application;
- 4) continue employment with their current Tempe district/school for the 2018-2019 school year; and
- 5) be a full-time educator.

APPLICATIONS

Informational posters are located at the Principals' offices of **all** TUHSD and TD3 schools, and **only** Kyrene elementary and middle schools in Tempe, and at the district offices. Other schools within Tempe City limits will have the posters available in their front office, too. In addition, explanatory fliers are available at all principals/headmasters' offices. All expenses above (1-5) are assumed by your host teacher while you are in their country; therefore, you are expected to assume these same financial responsibilities for your visiting teacher.

*Any plans/group activities agreed upon by the group members must be **paid equally** by all members of the group.

****Chosen candidate ambassadors must have or must apply for a passport “immediately” upon notification of selection. If you have a current passport, it must be valid thru December, 2018. PROOF OF PASSPORT must be provided to Linda Parrish by March 15, 2018.**

Remember: The Tempe Sister Cities Corporation is paying your way to Germany and/or Sweden (estimated cost \$1700), New Zealand (\$2,400), Macedonia (\$2,100), or *Ireland and *Peru (cost TBD); however, your visiting teacher **DOES NOT** have airfare provided for her/him. We are the **only country** in our exchange **that pays teachers’ airfare.**

INTERNATIONAL EDUCATOR EXCHANGE PERSONAL QUESTIONNAIRE

Retype each of the following questions (1-11) followed by your answer. Attach to application.

1. Where do you live?
 - What are the major cross-streets?
 - What is your travel time to and from work?
 - How will you get your visiting teacher to and from events?
 - Will others help you with transportation?
 - If your car becomes disabled, how will you meet the travel obligation?
2. Since your “team support” consists of those traveling with you to your guest’s country, if transportation to or from events here would be easier as a team effort, how are you willing to work with your members to provide this service? Explain.
3. Will your guest reside at the address listed on the application form?
4. Who lives in your home?
 - List adults, children and their ages, and anyone else residing in your residence.
 - Have you discussed the possibility of having an exchange teacher with those who reside in your home?
 - What is their response? Are they supportive? Explain.
5. Identify with a YES or NO answer and the proper explanation.
 - Do you have pets? If so, identify your pets.
 - Are you allergic to pets? If so, please explain.
 - Do you have allergies? If so, please explain.
 - Do you smoke? Are you allergic to smoke?
 - How would you accommodate your guest if they were allergic to pets, if they smoked, etc.?
6. If asked, are you willing to open your home for a social event with the visiting teachers and others on your team?
 - Explain how you might host an event?
7. List your regular activities. (Examples: Sport teams, gym attendance, church attendance, social groups, continuing education, tutoring, etc.)
 - How would these activities and/or commitments need to be adjusted in order to accommodate your guest? Explain.
 - In which of these activities would your guest be able to participate?
 - What arrangement would you make for him/her while you are gone?
8. Do you have a second job? Explain.
 - What is the time commitment to this job?
 - How will you adjust this commitment during your guest’s stay?
9. What special dietary habits or needs do you have? Explain.
 - If your guest has special dietary habits or needs, how would you accommodate them?
10. Sometimes there is NOT A GENDER match in the hosting experience. Do you have any concerns being paired with a person of the opposite sex and/or one that is single, married, divorced, with or without children? Explain.
11. What foreign language(s) do you speak? Or, any other resident in your home?
